You are required to:

Question 05

Nuwan owns an Advertising Agency and hired **Rukaa** to design a new theme song for a politician who is going to contest for the General Election. **Rukaa** is a freelance musician and works on various projects for different clients. **Nuwan** provided **Rukaa** with a brief for the song, including specific requirements and deadlines. **Rukaa** was free to choose his working hours, and he used his own equipment and software to complete the song composition task. **Rukaa** submitted the theme song to **Nuwan** and **Rukaa** was paid a fixed fee for the project.

After a few months, **Nuwan** decided to offer **Rukaa** for designing more songs and suggested that **Rukaa** should work exclusively for **Nuwan** for the next six months. **Nuwan** also proposed that **Rukaa** should follow a set of guidelines issued by **Nuwan**, use **Nuwan's** studio equipment, and report the progress weekly to **Nuwan**.

You are required to:

- (a) **Explain** whether **Rukaa** would be classified as an employee or an independent contractor under the labor law. (07 marks)
- (b) State three(03) main functions of the Employees' Trust Fund (ETF) as per the ETF Act No. 46 of 1980. (03 marks) (Total 10 marks)

Question 06

Island Machinery Ltd. is a company incorporated under the Companies Act No. 07 of 2007 in the year 2017. According to the Articles of Association of **Island Machinery Ltd.**, the primary objective of the company is to engage in manufacturing and selling industrial machinery, including the production, marketing, and distribution of such equipment.

The Articles of Association of **Island Machinery Ltd.** also includes a clause stating that any dispute between members of the company must be resolved through arbitration.

In response to the economic challenges posed by the recent global economic downturn, **Anil**, a director of **Island Machinery Ltd.**, has proposed to purchase four advanced commercial coffee machines at a cost of US \$50,000 each through a financing arrangement. He suggested leasing these coffee machines to coffee shops and the company can generate rental income. Considering these facts, the company purchased four coffee machines.

Chandra, a major shareholder of **Island Machinery Ltd.**, disagreed with this proposal and has initiated a legal action against the company.

You are required to:

Question 07

(A) Sanjaya operates a business as the name of GreenTech situated in Ratnapura. His business specializes in producing eco-friendly bamboo furniture. On 8th January, Sanjaya contacted over the phone a bamboo supplier, Priyantha, who lives in NuwaraEliya, offering to purchase 500kg of bamboo at Rs.5,000/- per kilogram. He requested Priyantha to accept or reject the offer through a postal letter to Sanjaya's office in Ratnapura. Priyantha posted a letter accepting the offer on the morning of 10th January, which arrived at Sanjaya's office on 13th January. Meanwhile, Ramesh, another bamboo supplier, heard about Sanjaya's offer and decided to accept it. On the evening of 10th January, Ramesh met Sanjaya and agreed to supply 500kg of bamboo at a reduced price of Rs.4,500/- per kilogram. Ramesh delivered the bamboo as requested. Sanjaya then disclosed the contract with Ramesh and rejected Priyantha's bamboo. Priyantha is now considering legal action against Sanjaya.

Additionally, **Sanjaya** discovered that extracts from his bamboo processing could be used to make a special type of packaging, which he named "**EcoWrap**." He advertised this product with a reward offer stating.

"Rs.100,000 reward for any person who claims damages for the usage of EcoWrap.

You are expected to follow the instructions properly."

Kumara, a packaging designer, purchased **EcoWrap** from **GreenTech** and used it to design packaging for organic products according to the instructions provided by **GreenTech**. Unfortunately, the packaging disintegrated within a week, leading to the loss of the products.

You are required to:

(a) **Explain** whether **Sanjaya's** telephone call made a valid offer to **Priyantha**.

(03 marks)

(b) **Discuss** whether **Priyantha** could take legal actions against **Sanjaya**. (06 marks)

(c) **Discuss** whether **Kumara** could take legal actions against **Sanjaya**. (06 marks)

(B) Rajeev is an estate owner and he wrote a letter to Saman informing him that he would be traveling abroad for one year. During this period, Rajeev expected Saman to manage his estate to collect any outstanding payments, and to maintain the estate. Rajeev instructed Saman to keep him updated regularly on any issues and the status of the estate. Additionally, Rajeev explicitly prohibited Saman from making any purchases on credit.

Subsequently, **Saman** met **Rajeev** and obtained the keys and relevant documents for the estate. Despite the prohibition, **Saman** purchased some supplies on credit from **Nimal** to support the estate's operations. **Saman** also developed a vegetable garden on part of the estate, generating approximately Rs.120,000/- per month as income, but he did not inform **Rajeev** about this.

Further complicating matters, **Saman** delegated some of his responsibilities to **Kamal**, a local resident, without informing **Rajeev**. **Kamal**, acting on his own accord, made additional purchases on credit from **Nimal** for the estate's maintenance.

When **Rajeev** eventually got to know about the estate and questioned **Saman**, he also insisted that the amount owed to **Nimal** should not be paid, citing that **Saman** had no authority to buy items on credit. **Rajeev** also regretted about the unauthorized delegation of duties to **Kamal**.

You are required to:

(a)	Discuss whether Saman has breached any duties owed to Rajeev as his agent.
